**PLC Notes:**

A few words about **Baptism**: the first of the seven sacraments. It is a starting place, a beginning point for our faith. We perhaps take it for granted, but it is very important. It is our Christian Initiation. It is often veiled in local tradition, and we think most often of infant baptism, because in this country, in this Christian environment, that is what is most common. In some locations and cultures adult baptisms may be the norm. But the universal church has rites, guidelines, customs that help us to make it truly an outward sign of our common faith. The symbols that are used are the same symbols that we have used for the entire Lenten and Easter seasons, to unite us to the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus. Baptism incorporates us into the family of Christ. It forms us into God's people. It is a sign of inclusion into our faith. There are rites for baptism of children, and rites for adults; rites for use during Mass and rites for use outside of Mass; there are rites for the Easter Vigil, and rites for groups of children or adults, or for individuals. The church offers "requirements" for the celebration of Baptism, and options. It is important for us to know and recognize the symbols, the essentials, and yet accept that there are many options and differing needs. But for all situations, the church takes very seriously, the preparation for baptism, the instruction, the teaching of the catechumens, or of the parents, in the case of infants, so that our faith is handed on.


In baptism, the cleansing with **water** washes away every stain of sin, makes us sharers in God's own life and his adopted children. Baptism recalls and makes present the paschal mystery, and should therefore reflect the joy of the resurrection. The **Easter candle** from which a baptismal candle is lit, symbolizes this paschal mystery. The **white garment** of baptism symbolizes the new life. The anointing of the baptized person with the oil of **chrism** in the presence of God's people, another reminder of being incorporated into a "holy nation, a royal priesthood." And then there are the **scripture readings, the prayer of the faithful, and a profession of faith**, all part of our usual Sunday liturgy. The church prefers that Baptisms occur on Sunday, our day of special celebration, and the church prefers that it occur as part of the Sunday Liturgy, "where the people of God, represented not only by the parents and godparents, and relatives, but also, as far as possible, by friends, and neighbors, and members of the local church," who are to welcome this newest member and stand in solidarity, in supporting the faith of each other. All are renewed in their faith as each one is baptized. All are responsible for the growth of faith and life of each other. It is truly a community event, just as Eucharist, and Matrimony are community events. We are all blessed by the presence of the newest member, infant or adult. Let us in turn welcome and bless them.

We are still accepting nominations for the pastoral council and for the Faith Formation Commission. But this is the last call. The ballot will soon be created. 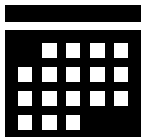
