PLC Notes:

Today we celebrate **Catechetical Sunday**. The Archdiocese chose the theme of "Living as Missionary Disciples." We have been talking about a Missionary Disciple, and the life of Stanley Rother continues below. Some of the qualities of his life are ones we will want to cultivate and strive for. We've also been talking about "being called by name," and this morning, we will call each catechist by name. Each one of us is called by name to live as missionary disciples, to give our lives to the service of handing on our faith to others, to witnessing the Gospel by our lives. Those who have taken on the role of catechists and aides will be commissioned this morning, and recognized for the great gifts of time and talent that this commitment entails. We are most grateful for their service! Catechetical Sunday is also a time for each one of us to reflect on our role as catechists, as missionary disciples, and on the time and talent each one of us is called to share. How will we pass on our faith and witness to the Gospel?

Called By Name: On Wed., Oct. 4th, Archbishop Thompson will be having Mass and dinner with young people from our deanery who were invited through the "Called By Name" program. In order to support these and all young people in discerning their vocations, "Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament" times will be available that day in different parishes throughout the deanery. You are invited to stop by and pray for our youth, for vocations to the priesthood and religious life, and for all those suffering in our world! Here at Immaculate Conception Adoration will run from 11:00 AM to 2:00 PM. Also available is a list of adoration times and places throughout the Deanery. If another time or location fits better into your schedule, please avail yourself of the opportunity. A reminder: When the Blessed Sacrament is exposed, it can never be without an adorer, there must always be someone in the church. Please don't leave your post until your replacement arrives. A sign-up sheet is available this morning in the entryway.

"Time & Talent": Our re-commitment process continues. Please place completed forms in the basket.

- "The Shepherd Who Didn't Run: Fr. Stanley Rother, Martyr from Oklahoma" as introduced a couple of weeks ago, this ordinary farmer and priest made a difference in the lives of others. He is being beatified (the first step to sainthood) on September 23, in Oklahoma City, becoming the first martyr born in the United States. The book notes five qualities this missionary martyr proclaimed with his life. We covered three of those qualities last week: **Ordinary**: he lived an ordinary life; **Mercy**: he lived out the works of mercy; and **Compassion**: showed God's love to all around him.
- **4.) Perseverance:** When Rother was in the seminary he failed the first year of theology, and was sent home and advised to pursue a different vocation. Instead, he visited the bishop who recognized something special in him, and assisted him to find another seminary. His struggle to learn (in his case it was Latin)

is something all of us can relate to. But he didn't give up. His perseverance continued. Years later, this young man who had flunked out of seminary due to a struggle with Latin, became the same man who agreed to go to a foreign mission that required him to learn not only Spanish, but also the rare and challenging dialect of his parishioners.

5.) Confidence in God: While optimism is a mental attitude that may or may not be based on reality, Confidence in God looks at real life with the certainty of God's presence, regardless of the circumstances. Less than a year before his murder he wrote: "The reality is that we are in danger. But we don't know whengiven the situation I am not ready to leave here just yet. I don't want to desert these people . . . there is still a lot of good that can be done under the circumstances." That is Confidence in God! And that is love. When one loves, one loves till the end! In his last letter home he said, "the shepherd cannot run at the first sign of danger." Stanley Rother, the shepherd who chose to face death rather than abandon his flock, the shepherd who didn't run, loved to the end. And in so doing, he made God's presence real and tangible to the people in his life. Father Stanley Rother, Servant of God, pray for us!
