More than 1,900 cities across the United States and Canada are expected to participate this year. One of those cities is Greensburg, Indiana, offering us an opportunity to take part. The Greensburg event is on N. Lincoln Street and 10<sup>th</sup> Street, from 2-3 pm. Please join us for the Life Chain to show respect for all LIFE. Bring your family and friends.
