Today is the **Canonization Day** for two modern day saints: Pope Paul VI, and Oscar Romero. While Pope Paul VI is familiar to us, Oscar Romero may not be. Born August 15, 1917, and trained by his father as a carpenter, he entered the local seminary when he was 13, and completed his studies in Rome. In 1974 he was appointed bishop of a poor diocese in El Salvador, and three years later was named Archbishop of San Salvador. Archbishop Romero initially enjoyed a reputation as a conservative, following Ignatian Spirituality, but was regarded as a radical when he began criticizing social injustice following assassinations there in the country. When a revolutionary group seized power in 1979, Romero remarked that the new leaders would “undoubtedly sharpen the injustice and the political repression inflicted” on his people, whose struggle had often been for their most basic human rights. On March 23, 1980 he challenged the Salvadoran military to obey God’s “higher call” and to refrain from carrying out the government’s violations of human rights. The next day, after taking part in a Day of Recollection, he celebrated an evening Mass, during which he was shot and killed. A priest, bishop, Archbishop, Missionary, and Martyr for his faith, for the people he served.

Visitation will be today from 1-5 at Porter Funeral Home, beginning with the rosary. Funeral and burial will be at St. Mary’s Monday morning at 10:00 following another hour of visitation. We thank Rick and Barbara for lovingly caring for Margie, and we support the family with our prayers.
