Prayer Shawl Ministry: a note from Angie Maloney, member of St. Mary's "Prayer Shawl Ministry" which she initiated this year. This very successful ministry was started to serve the members of her own parish, St. Mary. But she lives just south of Millhousen, and is willing to assist us in getting a similar ministry started here. Shawls are made for people who are ill, grieving, or have any special prayer intentions. Basically, the members crochet/knit prayer shawls, and pray while working on them. When finished, the shawls are blessed by Father, and distributed to anyone who is in need. The group attaches little prayer cards to each shawl. That can vary. They take requests from people, and this affords them the opportunity to pray for an individual while they are working on a shawl. Shawls are left in an available spot for pick up. They are free, but full of prayers! And may be taken or given to anyone who has a need. Angie says: "I have crocheted since I was seven years old. I had looked for ways in the past to use my talent to help others . . . I have found a way now! I have also heard stories from the recipients of the shawls. They have found comfort and peace from use of the prayer shawls. That makes this ministry so rewarding!" July is a busy month! We celebrate Independency Day and many other occasions. One of those noteworthy days is the Feast of St. Anne, July 26<sup>th</sup>. We don't know much about St. Anne, but we know this: she was the only woman who gave birth to the Immaculate Conception. Confused? Oh, don't be. If you aren't clear about what the Immaculate Conception is, here is what it is not. It is not Christ being born without the benefit of sex. No, that is what we call the "Virgin Birth." The Immaculate Conception is the conception of Mary, in the womb of her Mother, Anne, in the regular way, but without the stain of Original Sin. So, she was born pure. How amazing. Anne is the grandmother of Jesus, so he still had to listen to her! She is also the mother-in-law of St. Joseph. She was born in Bethlehem and married to Joachim. And that is about all we know of her. She is never mentioned in the bible. The name Anne comes from the Hebrew name Hannah, which means Grace.
