How many have read Pope Francis's encyclical on the environment, "**Laudato Si**?" We have several copies in the office if anyone would like to borrow one to browse through his words and thoughts about creation and what we are doing to preserve (or destroy) it. And have you read about the "**Season of Creation**?" Representatives of several Christian churches, including Catholics, Anglicans, and Orthodox, are urging the faithful to see September as the "Season of Creation" in an effort to raise awareness about climate change.

During the month-long Season of Creation, Christians on six continents are working to put "Laudato Si" into practice. They will participate in community events to deepen their love for the Creator, creation, and each other. We have been put to the challenge. What are we doing collectively for our earth? How do we contribute to preserving it for future generations? How can we come together to make a difference?

Jerry Fry has set the pace for us on many occasions, and has encouraged us to recycle, to clean up our toxic waste, to improve our own environment, and to protect our water and land. Yesterday was toxic waste recycle day, and Jerry, as in years past, was ready and willing to collect our old paint or varnish or oil, TV's or computers, or copiers or batteries, and move it all to the recycle site. Thank you, Jerry, for modeling this "right relationship" with our earth, and for helping to clean up our campus! One part of the process is removing and properly disposing of waste. Another part is replacing trees and plants and encouraging growth and improving the air quality and beauty of our living space. This past week, a project that Jerry initiated more than a year ago, to drain and dispose of the oil in the tank beside our church, finally came to completion. Ken Stone and team put the finishing touches on filling the old tank with flowable cement. This process was chosen to fill the empty space below the ground, (after oil left over from the days of the boiler, was removed), and at the same time maintaining the integrity of the church foundation. Thank you, gentlemen!

What else can we do? Our Archbishop has commissioned all parishes, during this "Season of Creation", September 1 to October 4, (the Feast of St. Francis of Assisi, the first environmentalist), to plant a tree. See Criterion article of last week. What a difference it would make if each parish actually followed this mandate!
