We are most grateful for your generosity and support! A more detailed report will be coming from our Parish Council/Finance Committee, as promised, right after the first of the year. We owe a lot to the generosity of our parishioners! But in addition, we have received considerable assistance from friends and non-parishioners! Join in thanking God for his bounty!
