COVID RELATED PRECAUTIONS:

A word from the Archdiocese concerning **The Sunday Mass Dispensation**:

"While commending our pastors and parish life coordinators who have gone to great lengths to assure safe worship spaces in our churches, due to the increase in the COVID-19 cases in our state, the Indiana Bishops have decided to extend the dispensation from the obligation of Sunday Mass attendance until November 1, 2020, unless further developments determine otherwise."

The update goes on to say that all people 65 or older and those who are sick or have medical conditions that make them especially vulnerable to the coronavirus are encouraged to remain at home. While this is a relief to some, it comes as a blow to many of our elders. Many of them are longing to rejoin us on Sundays. We at Immaculate Conception will welcome all, and encourage each person to make individual and appropriate decisions, based on their condition and personal judgement. We will continue to create and maintain a safe environment for all who choose to attend. Putting all judgements aside, we will support the individual's freedom of choice. All who attend, however, will need to continue safe practices, by masking, hand sanitizing, and safe distancing. We are grateful to our ushers and will continue to follow their direction. They are attentive and aware of how to accommodate the group. We cannot afford to become laxed.

Reminder: our Church property remains closed for all but essential meetings or activities. Mass is an essential activity. Please remember to go directly to your car after receiving communion each Sunday morning. And be advised that masks are to stay on until you reach your car. On church grounds these are not optional guidelines.

A reminder: we are not using or touching the kneelers in church. For the present time, we will only stand, genuflect and sit. Frequent attendees have mastered this new habit! New comers may find it difficult.

I draw your attention to an article in the **Criterion** this week, appearing on page 2, related to the obligation, or dispensation from the obligation, to attend Sunday Mass. The article clearly educates us on all related questions from Canon Law to **"inconvenience."** Many have questions. Many are concerned that those currently not attending will never come back. Some no longer feel the obligation at all. And our elders, who are completely vulnerable, are the ones who struggle with guilt and long to return. Hope this article clears up some of the misconceptions. Please remember that there are no obligations at this time. We will resume normal attendance Nov. 1st, unless informed otherwise.

• SEASON OF CREATION – WEEK 1 – September 1 -5, 2020

This year we have chosen to adapt portions of the *Ecumenical Prayer Service for the Season of Creation*, prepared for this event. The planning committee included World Council of Churches, Lutheran World Federation, World Evangelical Alliance, Global Catholic Climate Movement, Anglican Communion Environmental Network, Lausanne Creation Care Network, the World Communion of Reformed Churches, the European Christian Environmental Network, and Christian Aid.

We will again use the format: PRAY, PONDER, PRACTICE for each week.

PRAY: Gathering Rite

We gather in the name of the Triune God, Creator, Redeemer, and Sustainer of the Earth and all its creatures!
