The **Governor** has spoken, and so has the Archdiocese. We are taking a step backwards, back into stricter precautions. Our gathering is more limited, though we will be using the same methods of social distancing, hand washing, and mandatory masking. We are facing nothing new, but are asked to reinforce what we already do. We are mandated to stay six feet apart, so the tape is back to distance spacing in the pews. The ushers will again assist with seating. Please listen and follow their guidance. It won't be forever. We will ease up as soon as possible. But it may be longer than we like. The Archdiocese has asked us to cancel everything except Mass and the sacraments. Luckily our Religious Ed. program has previously planned to be off for a few weeks for the Christmas break. There will be no classes next Sunday. The following Sunday, Dec. 6th, we will meet for the sacrament of Reconciliation. All students are expected to meet in the classrooms unless otherwise instructed.

It has become **most imperative** to **sign in** as we enter the building. Contact tracing, while difficult, is designed to keep everyone safe. We have added more names to our list of attendees. Most are alphabetized. Just circle your name and add numbers for children attending.

We are **Happy to have Fr. Santhosh** back with us this weekend. Though he tested negative, and completed his quarantine, Fr. Stan Pondo is still sick and Fr. Santhosh is covering all three parishes. The other two parishes are not as small as we are. So, we need to be flexible. This morning he is booked for a 9:30 Mass after he leaves here, so we will curtail as much as possible to get him on his way. To save his time, we will have communion this morning at the end of Mass.

Cancelled: While Thanksgiving is not a Holy Day of obligation, it behooves us to give thanks, for our lives, and health, and all of the blessings which are poured upon us! However, given the current situation, it is also prudent to NOT come together. So, the Wednesday evening Mass has been cancelled. If you gather as a family please begin your celebration with a time of prayer and thanks. And if it becomes one more day for you to be alone, thank God for the blessings of family and friends, and food and shelter. This time of trial will surely end. Remember those less fortunate. And, maybe pick up the phone to reach out to someone you would like to spend time with. Thank them for being in your life. Email a friend or family member. Share a tale of Thanksgivings past. And remember those who have gone before us. The harvest is plenty! We have indeed been blessed!

Collection Counters: Per Archdiocesan policy and the code of Canon Law, counting of Sunday collections is required to be done by parishioner volunteers. While the task is very "regulated by policy" it is not hard. It takes about 30 min. or less each Sunday, and any dedicated volunteer could be trained and would succeed. The most ideal situation would be for two dedicated (and unrelated) individuals to work together each Sunday to find their rhythm. In addition, we would need a couple of substitutes, who would be able to fill in whenever the assigned individuals are away, ill, or need a break. We have one dedicated volunteer. We need a few more. The ideal counting time is immediately after Mass on Sunday. Deposits are done on Mondays so that receipts are available for the bookkeeper on Tuesday. If you are interested, and have a little time each week, or frequently, on Sunday morning, please consider this role. We need to have a working plan to respond to the auditor.

Confessions: Fr. Santhosh has been available for confessions each Sunday after Mass for the past two weeks and has had no one take advantage of the opportunity. He will not be available this morning following Mass. We will post a date for confessions in December.

COVID RELATED PRECAUTIONS:

The dispensation from the obligation to participate at Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation is extended in the Archdiocese and throughout the whole State of Indiana until further notice.

Those who are 65 and over and those with high risk health conditions are strongly encouraged to remain at home. This is the population that is most vulnerable to the coronavirus. Those who are symptomatic or have tested positive for COVID-19 are not to enter a church until released to do so by their health care professional.

Those requested to quarantine due to contact tracing, or close contact with someone who has tested positive, are asked to not return for at least 14 days.

We at Immaculate Conception will welcome all. We have the obligation to maintain a safe environment, so that we can continue to keep our churches open. Each person, regardless of age, needs to self-screen, and to think about the risk that they impose, not only on themselves, but on each person that they may come in contact with. All who attend will need to continue **masking, hand sanitizing, and safe distancing.** We will continue to NOT use the kneelers. We will continue to provide a "safe space" within the sanctuary and sacristy. Please observe this boundary, including light switches, sound system etc.
