Baminelli Sunday

Baminelli Sunday is a beautiful tradition celebrated on Gaudete Sunday, the third Sunday od Advent. Thousands of people come to St. Peter's Square bringing the Baby Jesus figurines from their creches and nativity scenes. During the Pope's Angelus address, he blesses all of the little figures of the Child Jesus. Families also traditionally spend their Advent season making small sacrifices or doing good deeds for the Child Jesus, represented by adding a piece of straw to His manger for each good deed performed. When Christmas Day arrives, the Baby Jesus is placed in the empty creche made comfortable by these acts of charity. Today, we bring our own Baby Jesus figurines, to have them blessed. Right after communion, we will **lift them up** as Fr. does the blessing for us. Let's see how much straw we can accumulate in each manger by our small sacrifices, and acts of kindness, by Christmas Eve, and then place our babies on this comfortable bed.

Christmas – Christmas will look, and feel, and sound, so much different this year! But we will celebrate Christmas just the same, and perhaps next year some of the old traditions will return, or maybe we will like the changes! Not even COVID can take Christmas out of our hearts! The first big change, that will impact all of us, is the timing of our Christmas Liturgy. Instead of Mass at 4:00 pm, ours will be at **3:00 pm** this year, to help our priests with scheduling all three parishes. Last year we started having only one Liturgy. We thought then, that we could easily all fit into one celebration. We had over 385 attendees on Christmas Eve. Currently we are averaging 120 on a good Sunday, and sometimes less. But we think this is a good number and that we can accommodate all who may show up, yet stay socially distanced. It has been recommended, and many churches are following this recommendation, to pre-register everyone and reserve seats, with on-line registration. We are NOT following this recommendation. We don't know how many to expect, but we do not want to turn anyone away. Yet we have only one liturgy. So, I am encouraging everyone who wants to come, to please come early, and take your places. Families can gather more tightly to allow others more space. We will set up chairs. Ushers will assist. And we will make it work. Another big change, is that the children's choir will not be singing. It was not possible to have rehearsals safely with them. And they will take up less space grouped with their families. The Men's choir will sing, and their "safe space" is the choir loft. The loft will not be used for over flow of the crowd. Chances are, the crowd will not be a huge issue. We also are **NOT** decorating in our usual style. The many trees and large nativity scene will come back next year. Again, it is not safe to gather the crew and still follow sanitation and social distancing regulations. The simpler decorations will still lift our spirits. We still want to honor the second grade as is our tradition, but we may not be able to have all of the children adorn the tree. We are working on that. They have created their homemade ornaments. We would like

to follow the tradition of **ringing all the bells** during the Gloria, so if you have bells and want to join in, please bring them along. Anyone of any age can join in the ringing. Two of our Confirmation students are working on the Luminaria. It may not be dark enough to appreciate the beauty of the lights as we exit the church, but as the evening darkens they will continue to glow. We **WILL** celebrate and be grateful for his coming!

Remember in Prayer: Nell Ann Pfeifer, who is again declining, Judy Zapfe, Jim Price, Mike Witka, Ruth Atchley (sister of Jeanie Harrison), Rylie Bennett, Denis DiGiusto, and all those newly infected with the COVID 19 virus and their families. In addition, let's remember all those who have lost loved ones since last Christmas, and are facing the first Christmas without them.

The service and burial took place on Friday here at Immaculate Conception. Please remember them all in your prayers!
