Liturgy Notes: All parishioners, of any age, are encouraged to **resume** liturgy attendance each Sunday. The "coming together" is our way to support one another, to build up our community. The celebration of the Eucharist at Mass is the center of our life and mission as Catholics. It is our nourishment, food for our spirits, our source of joy, and a "joyful **obligation**" each and every Sunday, as members of the Catholic Church. As always, those who are **sick or homebound are exempt from this obligation**.

To assist us in encouraging parishioners to return to the Eucharist with joy, the Archdiocese has prepared a number of very **brief videos**, each addressing a specific facet of what a gift and privilege it is for us to attend

Exchange of Peace: A reminder that the gesture of offering peace to one another is to be "touchless" as we move forward. We may nod or wave or smile, or verbally greet, but we are encouraged to NOT shake hands, hug, or in anyway touch another. This is understood throughout the diocese and encourages respect for the other. It is easy to fall back into old patterns, and hard not to. Be at PEACE.

Concerning COVID-19 vaccinations: ALL are strongly encouraged to receive the vaccine "to promote the common good and protect the health of the most vulnerable among us." This message is sent from Pope Francis, Archbishop Thompson, the State Department of Health, the World Health Organization, etc. One hears it every time we tune into the news. As I monitor the state numbers each week, it is clear Indiana is doing well in keeping the virus spread under control, however, the variant strain is increasing, especially among those unvaccinated. Those states which have not embraced the vaccine are spiking again; new diagnosis, hospitalizations and deaths are again on the rise. Concerning Religious Ed: vaccines and masks are not currently required. However, unless other direction comes from the Archdiocese, we will follow the protocols of the South Decatur School System.

Concerning the Sacrament of Reconciliation (Penance, Confession) We have had a long history of offering the sacrament, every Sunday before Mass. But when Fr. Bill left us in September, that ended and a time after Mass was offered as an alternative. Our numbers had been dropping off for a few years, so when no one was coming every Sunday, we asked what time would be good for you. No responses came in, so we have continued to scan the back of church, each Sunday morning, the St. Denis bench in particular, to look for folks waiting for the sacrament. Beginning this month, August, we are going back to a time **before** Mass. Every third Sunday of the month, at **8:10 am,** Fr. Jey will be in the confessional. Maybe going back to our old pattern will be helpful.

In December, as always, we will offer an **Advent Penance Service**, to accommodate all of the Religious Ed. students. This year it will be on **December 5**th during the regular Religious Ed. class time, that is right after Mass. **ALL Parishioners are welcome to attend**. More details to come.
