Painting Project: The scaffolding remains in place, just waiting to be removed. The truck will come at its earliest convenience. The painters continue working on the side walls with the help of a lift. Scraping and patching, mudding and sanding, and painting continue. Most of this week they have had four workers rather than two, so more progress is seen. The three entry ways have been painted, but not the cry room or restroom yet. Two of the ten windows are completed. The choir loft and staircase have not yet been started. A reminder to pray for the safety of our crew, and for a satisfactory completion to the project. We are still aiming for Thanksgiving as a date to be back into Church. But you wouldn't guess it by looking. So, stay tuned. There is much to be done.

The FDA has now approved the use of the Pfizer vaccine prepared for children age 5-11, and it should be available within a few days. Along with the children's dose, booster doses are now available for all three approved vaccine brands. So, no matter the brand of the initial vaccine, everyone over the age of 65 may receive a booster dose, six months after their initial doses. Approval was also given to mix and match brands. Various pharmacies are stocked and ready to go. No appointments needed.

It is not too late to get Flu vaccines for this flu season. We have many opportunities for prevention and immunity boosting.

At our semiannual **Archdiocesan Business Meeting** this week, we learned of plans to establish a Diocese wide Capitol Campaign in the near future. In lieu of that effort, all capital expenditures, repair projects, or building projects not already approved, have been put on a PAUSE, or on HOLD. Thank heavens ours have already been approved. While we may accept any funding that comes in, we may not establish any new capital campaigns at this time. As all costs are increasing for these projects, some parishes are not able to accommodate the increasing costs of fuel and energy. Our own income fluctuates greatly from week to week and month to month, but overall, we have been blessed! Thank you for your generosity!

The **Deanery Meeting** this week covered topics around the shortage of priests, and the plans to "import more priests from India." Once again, this year, there are more priests eligible for retirement than there are new ordinations. Next weekend we celebrate Vocations Awareness Weekend, and will receive bulletin stuffers offering statistics on the numbers, and the current efforts to attract your men and women to Religious Life. "The harvest is abundant but the laborers are few; so, ask the master of the harvest to send out laborers for his harvest." Luke 10:2 We are asked to submit the names of at least five young people from our parish who might have a priestly or religious vocation. It is our personal responsibility to invite, raise up, and **support** those young people, so that our faith may endure.

There is a worldwide movement coming together, to support our current priests. It is called (SMOP), **Spiritual Motherhood of Priests**, and is primarily a women's movement. If we are interested, and can surface a parish leader, the name will be submitted to the organizer, for more direction. The parish woman leader would organize a local group, following the provided guidance. Each member would "adopt" a priest, praying for him **daily**, and this commitment would be a **lifelong commitment** until the woman dies. If you are interested in coordinating a parish wide group, please call the parish office to submit your offer.

A hot item on the Deanery agenda is finding enough priests to staff Penance Services all throughout our Deanery during Advent. The complete list of Penance offerings will be circulated in our bulletin.
