Painting Project: The professional work is coming to an end. The lift and all scaffolding have been removed. Plastic covers are down and the first round of vacuuming is completed. The dust is settling. Detail work continues, including work on the frames of the stations. While a lot of cleaning is needed, it no longer looks like a war zone. This week, we hope to complete the stations and touch up work, finish installation of the new sound system, change out the furnace filters, and have the organ uncovered and reactivated. Between all of this a few ladies are bearing the load of cleaning, and hoping for a few more volunteers. With all of the usual Christmas activities we realize everyone has full calendars already. Please give Sister a call when you have an hour to assist, and specify the best time to fit your schedule. All of the furniture and wall hangings will need to be wiped and cleaned before being retuned to the building. If all goes well this week, we are hoping to gather a few strong men next week to assist in moving the furniture back. That activity is scheduled for Tuesday evening, December 14th, at 5:00 pm - until dark. Then, on Wednesday evening, December 15th, again beginning at 5:00 pm to make use of the diminishing daylight, we will gather to decorate. Again, we will need a few strong men to haul out the trees and bring back the nativity. If these times are not agreeable with your individual schedules, please call to volunteer when you ARE available. Sister will coordinate all of this activity, and will have a checklist prepared of work to be done. Our goal is still to be back in the newly painted church by December 19th, the Sunday before Christmas. We will need many hands that last week, and for most people that is the busiest time of the year. Any time you can carve out for us that week will be appreciated (Dec. 12-19). A reminder to pray for the safety of all, especially all who volunteer, as we move forward. This will need to be a united effort.
