The **blessing of the sick** by ministers of the Church is a very ancient custom, rooted in imitation of Christ himself and his apostles. In the United States the annual blessing of throats is a traditional sign of the struggle against illness in the life of **all** Christians. The blessing is ordinarily given during Mass on February 3, the memorial of Saint Blasé. Because we don't have weekday Masses, our custom has been to transfer this special blessing to the closest Sunday.

Saint Blasé was the Bishop of Sebaste in Armenia during the fourth century. Very little is known about his life. But according to various accounts he was a physician before becoming a bishop. His following spread throughout the entire Church in the Middle Ages because of his reputation, to have miraculously cured a little boy who nearly died because of a fishbone in his throat. Since the eighth century, Saint Blasé has been venerated as the patron of those who suffer diseases of the throat. We pray in a special way today for protection from afflictions of the throat, and from all other illnesses. The blessing of St. Blasé is a sign of our faith in God's protection and love for us and for all the sick and suffering.
