Sister represented us at the Archdiocesan Spring Business Meeting held in Bloomington on Tuesday of this past week, where two topics dominated the platform: The three-year Eucharistic Revival; and the potential for an Archdiocesan Wide Fundraising Campaign. You will continue to read and hear more about these two endeavors as the weeks unfold.

The Eucharistic Revival is a U.S. Church project initiated by the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops to reinforce the declaration made by the Apostolic Constitution on the Church, at the Second Vatican Council, some 50 years ago. The quote from Lumen Gentium (A light to the nations) declares that the Eucharist is "the source and summit of the Christian life." Everything we do as members of Christ's body flows from and back to our "source and Summit" in this Eucharistic celebration. The Eucharist should move us to deeper faith, and motivate us to live Christ's mission through ministry and evangelization.

Across 126 parishes, 68 Catholic schools, 5 Catholic Charities agencies, and many offices of ministry across central and southern Indiana, the Archdiocese of Indianapolis is united in faith, and dedicated to living and proclaiming Christ's mission. Since the roots of our faith community were planted nearly 190 years ago, our Church has proclaimed the Gospel of Joy to all people by living his mission of mercy, hope, and salvation.

In this new moment, (today), as we come out of a global pandemic, we must recognize and respond to our Church's needs and responsibilities as disciples to Proclaim the Good News and build God's Kingdom. As we confront new challenges, we must look for opportunities for the Church to respond to God's generosity. We have been deeply blessed. It is time to give thanks!

To meet the needs of this moment in time, we are invited to rethink the goals, structures, style, and methods of evangelization in our communities, and to translate this **permanent mission of the**Church into concrete initiatives that reflect the essential teachings of the Church. We begin by focusing on the Eucharist.

The first year of the Eucharistic Revival will be Archdiocesan in nature. It begins with an Archdiocesan Corpus Christi procession downtown Indianapolis, and all are invited to attend and join in this demonstration of our faith. Please mark your calendars for Sunday, **June 19th**, **2022**, at 3:00 pm. Search www.eucharisticrevival.org for more information.

The second year beginning in June of 2023, activities will center at the parish level. Each parish will honor the Eucharist and celebrate locally.

July 17-21 of 2024 will be the culmination of this three-year revival, as we gather to participate in the Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis. This national celebration is right in our own back yard! Please plan to attend. Every parish will want to send delegates and participate in this national event!
