The **Parish Administrator** role, beginning at noon on July 6, will be assumed by Fr. Binu Mathew, even as he continues his current role as Administrator of St. John Osgood. What that role will look like will be determined by Fr. Binu, as he balances responsibilities and time between the two parishes. Please welcome him and support him, with willingness to make the necessary changes, so that all needs can be met. He is a true pastor with great experience, and he will lead the way. Transition is difficult for all involved, parishioners as well as pastoral leaders. Please keep the whole Archdiocesan family in prayer as the next few weeks unfold.

Over the past year or two, our committee structure has been reduced in membership as terms expired, and as volunteers did not come forward to replace them. By mandate of Canon Law, a parish must maintain a Finance Council, and we were able to do that, reduced from four members to three members. This small dedicated group must review the financials each month and must budget, or approve all expenditures. As other committee work declined, this team truly functioned as a team, and saw us through a period of lessor income, at the same time moving forward with repairs, replacements, and many maintenance projects. While we can applaud many projects completed, this team facilitated that progress, and used continued good insight to prevent unneeded expenditures. At present we stand without debt, with greater combined resources than we had six years ago, and with satisfaction that our campus is in good repair. Thank you, ladies and gentlemen! We have had two positive financial audits, and just completed our second safety and maintenance audit in six years. The list of "needed repairs" this time around is much less, and does not threaten our closure due to inability to maintain our complex. Having said that, there are needed repairs that will require our immediate attention.

While recommended, the Parish Council is not a **required** committee. It is not a decision-making committee, but advises the Parish Administrator, offers ideas, and assists in the capacity needed or identified by the administrator. Both committees meet only when called together by the Parish Administrator, and only when the Parish Administrator is present. Because no one came forward to offer

service on this committee in the past two years, the committee was reduced to two members, but did meet and advised as needed as issues arose. Fr. Binu will utilize this committee as he deems necessary, and he will decide how many members he may need to function well as a team.

Currently, the immediate need identified by Fr. Binu is for support in the tasks, the work, of operating and maintaining the parish. This parish has been identified as perhaps the only parish, large or small, without secretarial support, without janitorial support, and without editorial support for the bulletin, and all communications. The Archdiocese offers workshops, classes, and offers guidelines and support for learning these parish functions and guides the hiring and job descriptions of these positions. They may be paid or voluntary, as decided by the Administrator. Please consider your abilities and skills, and communicate your willingness to serve, by Calling the parish office and leaving a voice message for Fr. Binu, or put your desire to assist in writing and send it to the parish office. Sister Donna's cell phone cannot be accessed by Fr. Binu, and he will not be providing access to his own cell phone. He will use the parish phone exclusively, and will communicate his office hours as the date of July 6<sup>th</sup> approaches. He is looking for committed, dependable, trustworthy, and flexible individuals who will work as a team under his direction, and adhere to Archdiocesan policies, and guidance. He will indeed supervise and manage all hiring, all employees, all volunteers, the finances, the sacramental and liturgical needs, all committees, all maintenance, all security (and keys) and all emergencies. He asks for interested and committed individuals to call the parish office, to make known your interest.

The "Catechesis for Discipleship Award" is a yearly recognition of one catechist from each parish to honor a teacher of the Catholic faith who has a strong, personal, disciple relationship with Jesus; inspires others to live such a relationship in full communion with Christ's body, the Church; and provides not only teaching but also a **joyful witness** to the goodness and beauty of a Catholic life.
