31st Sunday in Ordinary time

We read in the book of Genesis that, after their disobedience, Adam and Eve "hid from Yahweh among the trees of the garden. (Gen 3/8) How silly of man to think that there might be any place where he could hide from God! The Book of Genesis goes on to tell us that "God called to the man: 'Where are you?' "

Contrary to what we might be inclined to think at first, the purpose of God going in search of Adam and Eve after their disobedience, was not to punish them but to bring them back to himself. The story of Adam and Eve repeats itself in every man and every woman that comes into the world: sin takes us away from God, but God, in his love, goes in search of us the very moment we abandon him through sin. This is the message which is conveyed through the readings of today. God is always at work to save us. "For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but to save the world through him. (john 3/16-17). There is not a person whom God does not go in search of the moment he or she abandons him by sin, those who welcome God, obtain salvation. "Today salvation has come to this house, because this man, too, is a son of Abraham. For the Son of Man came to seek and to save the lost." (LK. 19/9-10)

Last Sunday, we heard Jesus speaking to us about a Pharisee and a tax collector who went up to the Temple to pray. It was not so much they who looked for God, as God who was looking for them, anxious to bestow on them his mercy and his joy. But only the tax collector 'allowed himself to be found by God' or 'open to the saving Grace of God'. The Pharisee, instead, though he thought himself close to God, went back home from the Temple distancing himself from God than he had come. But today something more: God accompanied the tax collector home, like a friend walking by the side of a friend, determined to stay with him. Whereas the pharisee had to put up with self-righteousness, pride and loneliness as his only companions. The ball is in your court, your choice, your decision, with whom you will go home after this Sunday service. "Here I am! I stand at the door and knock. If anyone hears my voice and opens the door, I will come in and eat with that person, and they with me." (Rev.3/20)
