Easter: The most important day in the liturgical calendar.

Some would say it is Christmas. A beautiful, happy day when Jesus was born. He became flesh so he could show us the way to live to gain eternal life. But we all have to be born.

Others would say it is Good Friday. Good Friday is an overwhelming day when we remember how Jesus was crucified - how he suffered unbelievable pain. In Christ's time the Romans were barbaric. Thousands of people were crucified and died a very slow, ugly death. But we all have to die.

But Easter Sunday when he rose from the dead – no one can match that. It proved he was truly God. We do not believe in the resurrection of Jesus because we have personally witnessed it, since it happened long ago and far away. We can only believe it because we consider trustworthy those who were eye witnesses and wrote about it and, more importantly, were willing to die for this belief rather than deny it.
