Why do we doubt:

The Second Reading has made the point that without seeing him Christians believe in Jesus. By relating the well known tradition concerning the unbelieving Thomas, the writer of John wants to shed further light on this point. He indicates that even seeing, as Thomas did, is no guarantee of faith. Faith comes by hearing the word of the risen Lord who addresses Thomas personally.

It is God, personally addressing you in an "I-Thou" situation. This intangible situation can never be fully explained just as we cannot explain what exactly happens when someone falls in love!!
