5th Sunday of Easter: There are times when we are more than usually sensitive to God"s word. Sometimes these may be the result of a happy or sad event in life, such as a wedding, funeral, birth, success, failure or even a deeply moving book, motion picture or televisione program. At other times there is no apparent reason for them at all.

We speak of 'disclosure moments,' times when we are more than usually open to some transcending reality.

Jesus said: "This is the time of fulfillment... Repent, and believe in the gospel. God is present to you in Christ, the Bible, the breaking of bread, any good person. The time of favor for you is when you experience this mysterious presence.

The first reading shows that the word of God continues to spread in and through human beings. There is dissension between the Greek and Hebrew speaking members of the congregation – a very human occurrence. But the ministry of the word, service to one another, and the Spirit of Jesus combine to keep them together. Indeed, "the eyes of the Lord are upon those who fear him".
