United Catholic Appeal: Our parish goal is \$12,516. To date we have pledged \$10,740. Number of donors in parish 45.

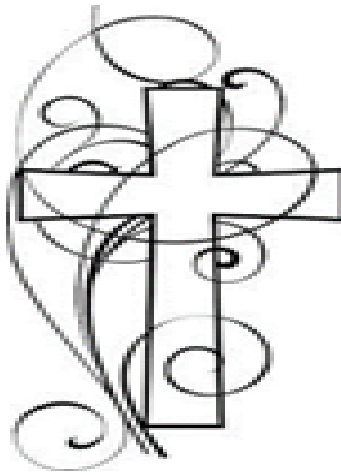
