**Priority of Values:** In today's readings wisdom is considered the supreme value of human life, and the parables of the treasure and the pearl bring out that the kingdom of God is a value for which no sacrifice is too great. It is a question of priority of values. Wise and mature Christians have a sound judgement about what is more or less important in life, since they blend human insight with the God-inspired wisdom of the Bible. "(God), the revelation of your words sheds light, giving understanding to the simple." (Responsorial Psalm)

The parables in the Gospel readings suggests that the kingdom of God is the supreme value of life, well worth the sacrifice of everything else. In our country there is no persecution of the Church as in Matthew's time. We are not required to sacrifice our physical lives for the kingdom of God. But in a society that is ever more doing away with values sacred to Christians, sound judgment about a priority of values is of paramount importance and could require sacrifice especially from young Christians!
