### **Religious Education Update:**

Grades 1-8 will have their first class on September 10. The students will meet immediately following Mass. ## **Bible Study:**

#### **Eucharistic Adoration:**

We will begin Eucharistic Adoration in the church on Friday, September 8. We will have adoration every Friday from 12 to 3. There is a sign-up sheet in the back of church for those wanting to participate. The adoration slots are in 30 minute increments. Also note whether you can be there weekly, once a month, or as a substitute. Check the time slot that you are interested in and how often you can attend. If interested in attending for an hour check 2 time slots. It is hoped that there will be two people signed up for each time slot so that if you can't attend, you can make a quick contact with the other person to see if they will be there. Signing up to attend weekly is a big commitment, but when you can't be there, a coordinator will find a substitute if needed. Someone will contact you to confirm your time of participation. - 5. Sunday is for family. Sundays should be special times for families, and not for work.
