Bambinelli Sunday: What is Bambinelli Sunday?

BAMBINELLI BLESSING – The Blessing of the Bambinelli is a tradition first instituted by St. John Paul II. The children are encouraged to bring the baby Jesus (Bambinelli) from each of their Nativity sets to Masses on the weekend of **December 17th**, the Third Sunday of Advent. This Advent tradition is a way for children to connect their Nativity scene at home to the celebration of Christmas at their church, but we are extending this new tradition to everyone. We ask everyone to bring the Baby Jesus from their Nativity scenes to Mass. The children will be asked to come forward with their Baby Jesus to be blessed, while the rest of the congregation will hold their Baby Jesus up for the blessing.

Did you know? - We all sin. Mortal sins can be forgiven through the sacrament of reconciliation, but we are also encouraged to confess venial sins. Jesus Christ has the power to forgive sins, and he entrusted this duty to His apostles. Bishops, as successors of the apostles, and priests as the bishops' collaborators, continue to exercise this ministry. The priest must keep secret all sins confessed to him.

According to the Church's command, "after having attained the age of discretion, each of the faithful is bound by an obligation faithfully to confess serious sins at least once a year." Anyone who is aware of having committed a mortal sin must not receive Holy Communion, even if he experiences deep contrition, without having first received sacramental absolution, unless he has a grave reason (i.e. immediate danger of death) for receiving Communion and there is no possibility of going to confession. – CCC1457
