Todays Gospel Theme:

Love One Another. John teaches us about love of God and neighbor. Friendship and complete joy that result in a meaningful life, "bearing fruit." But why do so many fail in love even after starting out so beautifully? Over the years, did they try to listen to one another? Was there an emphasis on mutual understanding, forgiveness after failures and fidelity to an initial 'yes' when it was difficult? Love, like a plant, must be cared for daily; otherwise it withers. Check your own life, have an honest discussion if necessary, pray and pattern your love after Jesus' example: "Love one another as I love you."
