The 10th National Eucharistic Congress is an invitation to experience profound personal revival so we can be sent out to share Christ's love with a world that so desperately needs it. The National Eucharistic Congress (NEC) is in need of several hundred volunteers for the upcoming event. There are many full-time and part-time volunteer opportunities available! This is a great opportunity for young adults, college students, retirees, or anyone who is looking for an affordable way to be a part of this historic event.

The scope of the daily commitment for full time dedicated volunteers is from Tuesday, July 16 at 9:00am until Sunday, July 21 at 2:00pm. (This includes a full day of volunteer training prior to the kick-off of the event.) For those who are unable to serve the entire time, part-time volunteer shifts in a variety of roles are open.

The greatest area of need is full-time volunteer ushers. This role entails greeting guests at sessions either in Lucas Oil Stadium or the other large programming halls at the Convention Center. The benefit of this job is that ushers get to hear much of the Congress programming for free!

Eucharistic Procession Sunday, June 16th:

Next Sunday June 16th at the end of Mass we will have a Eucharistic Procession with the Blessed Sacrament. And singing some hymns. Volunteers are needed to carry the canopy (four men); servers to carry incense and crucifix; two people to carry candles; and a person to carry flowers.
