What is Peter's Pence collection for?

In 1871, Pope Pius IX formalized the practice of lay members of the church and "other persons of good will" providing financial support to the Roman See. Modern "Peter's Pence" proceeds are used by the Pope for philanthropic works throughout the world and for administrative costs of the Vatican state.

A word from Pope Francis:

"Indeed, if the God of heaven is close, we are not alone on earth, and even in difficulty, we do not lose faith. Here is the first thing to say to people: God is not far away, but rather he is a Father. God is not distant, he is a Father, he knows you and he loves you; he wants to take you by the hand, even when you travel on steep and rugged paths, even when you fall and struggle to get up again and get back on track. He, the Lord, is there with you."

<u>12th Sunday in Ordinary Time:</u> Many of us have experienced the awesome power of a hurricane or tornado. All of us have seen on television what its devastating force can do. Small wonder that in prescientific times people saw God's anger and threat in storms and bad weather. "They cried to the Lord in their distress: he hushed the storm to a gentle breeze and the billows of the sea were stilled". Today, there are still Christians who light a blessed candle and pray to God when thunder and lightning threaten. Nor is this a bad thing! Prayer in faith is meaningful in any anxiety because it gives strength. God is with us!
