New Directions strives to increase social consciousness about domestic violence and to assist individual victims by helping them break free from the cycle of physical and emotional abuse. New Directions would greatly appreciate soap, shampoo, conditioner, deodorant, dental products, cleaning supplies, toilet paper, paper towels, facial tissues, laundry soap, etc. Any product donations may be brought to church during the month of June and placed in containers in the back of church. Pentecost Sunday: The Holy Spirit, Gift of the Father:

A full rigged ship under an unfurled sail makes a beautiful picture, but it does not move without wind. Without “the breath of life,” human beings cannot perform. An artist needs inspiration. The breath, animating Spirit, of God was given to us at baptism. On the fiftieth day after Easter the Jews celebrated the giving of the Mosaic Law at Sinai and the establishment of Israel as God’s People. At Pentecost we celebrate the giving of the Spirit of God’s people and, related to it, the establishment of the new Israel, the Church.

The Spirit, whom the Lord Jesus sends from the Father, will remind us of all that the Lord has taught us. He will animate us and help us to know and understand our religion not just with our mind but also with our heart and soul.

We must not stumble upon tomorrow, we must build it, and we all have the responsibility to do so in a way that responds to the project of God, which is none other than the happiness of mankind, the centrality of mankind, without excluding anyone.
