Acts of the Apostles: Peter- When Peter was in jail because of his courageous witnessing, the Church prayed for him. God showed his care for both the early Church and Peter. Both Peter and Paul were arrested time and again. But opposition never stopped them from doing what they thought they should do. We can learn from these two men. Being a Christian means that you are a witness of Christian values. You may be in for ridicule. Can you take it? Have faith like Peter and Paul, and make the Responsorial Psalm your prayer. "I will bless the Lord at all times; his praise shall be ever in my mouth. Let my soul glory in the Lord."

Thomas:

When the disciples objected to Jesus' return to Judea, where Lazarus had died, the Apostle Thomas' response was: "Let us also go, that we may die with him." The disciples knew the Jews in Judea had threatened to stone Jesus, yet a willing Thomas, through his first recorded words in Scripture, courageously rallied them.

The Apostle Thomas is often thought of today as "Doubting Thomas" because he questioned if Jesus had truly risen from the dead. The truth, however, is that he simply wanted to know if Christ's resurrection was real. Once he knew for sure, he took that message to the ends of the earth.

According to tradition in India, passed down orally through the centuries, Thomas arrived around A.D. 50 or 52 on India's Malabar Coast, which is a major spice exporting port even today. He is credited with founding seven churches, and thousands turned to Christ through his ministry.

Thomas was martyred around A.D. 70 by Hindu priests
