Reading Reflections:

The prophet called “Third Isaiah” addresses his fellow citizens who have returned from exile in Babylon. He urges them to rejoice, for they have regained freedom. He compares the holy city, Jerusalem, with a mother who receives the returning exiles back. But the prophet is well aware that rebuilding a ruined country is not so simple; it involves much frustration. Hence, he also consoles his people. Have hope! Sometime in the future, God will bestow prosperity on his chosen people!

We apply this promise to our own situation. We have been freed from the alienation/exile/bondage of evil. But we do not yet share in the blessings of the heavenly Jerusalem. It is the “already” and “not yet” we have to live with. Make the Responsorial Psalm your prayer of thanksgiving for what you possess as a Christian, and keep your hope alive for happiness to come. “For thus says the Lord..as a mother comforts her child, so will I comfort you.”
