Reading Reflections:

The Book of Deuteronomy (which means second law) is a series of sermons or meditations on the Law of Moses. This passage seems to have been composed during the exile in Babylon. The author lets Moses speak figuratively. We should heed the voice of the Lord. It is not far away. It is in your heart. In Christian terminology, follow your conscience, through which God speaks to you.

The Gospel deals with Jesus' commandment of love of God and neighbor. We cannot love God without loving our neighbor, nor conversely is love of neighbor possible without love of God. Faith tells us that all human beings are God's children. He loves all of them.
