**Reading Reflections:**

Since the Second Vatican Council there is a renewed awareness in the Church that cannot easily do enough for the deprived and the poor!

The reading today warns against luxury living and not being concerned about our unfortunate fellow humans. A rich lady once had occasion to drive the nuns of her parish to the slum area of town to deliver Christmas baskets. Her eyes were opened: "I did not know that such poverty existed right here!"

In the Gospel, we read that the rich man's eyes were opened too late! Abraham tells all who live luxuriously: "You have Moses and the prophets, i.e., your Bible. Why do you not read it, and apply its message honestly to your own life situation?"
