God's call and our response: In the Catholic tradition, the idea of vocation (calling) was very much restricted to priesthood and religious life. We should not forget that this special call rests upon the general call, which is basic to all Christians, namely, the call to a new existence. Today's Liturgy deals with the call of Abraham. Abraham never questioned or doubted God's promise. He went as the Lord directed him. God calls you in the history of your life. All his works are trustworthy. God has saved you and called you to a holy life. But the daily life experience of a Christian entails seeing "no one else but Jesus."
