16th Sunday in Ordinary time:

God's Forbearing Patience. In observing our fellow humans we should be careful not to think in just two categories: Good and evil. No person is entirely good, neither is anyone entirely evil. Some people look harshly upon all who are not in perfect consonance with their opinions about what people should be and do. They speak of "law and order" without considering the whole situation.

Advocating and pleading for law and order without eliminating poverty and slum conditions, without promoting equal education and job opportunity, without furthering constructive family life programs and facilities, without efficient rehabilitation programs for prisoners to be paroled is shameless hypocrisy. Better than any physician, social worker, or psychologist, God knows the case history of a person who has failed, and he is patient!
