17th Sunday in Ordinary Time Reflections:

During all the ages of human history, tribes and nations have had their sages, philosophers, friends of wisdom. Indeed, wisdom, insight, sound judgment, is a precious possession. But human wisdom is not always adequately the same as truth. In the Bible we find a type of wisdom that originates from both heart and intellect. It is an often intuitive wisdom of the total person. Moreover, Biblical wisdom is a special gift of God. That is why we pay attention to it.

In our country there is no persecution of the Church as in Matthew's time. We are not required to sacrifice our physical lives for the kingdom of God. But in a society that is ever more doing away with values sacred to Christians, sound judgment about a priority of values is of paramount importance and could require sacrifice especially from young Christians.!

A Word from Pope Leo: Pope Leo XIV asked the faithful to "cultivate kindness and respect in our families, among our friends, at work, on social media, in political debates, in the media and in Christian communities." In this way, words of hatred will give way to words of hope and peace.
